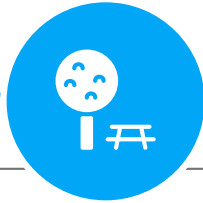

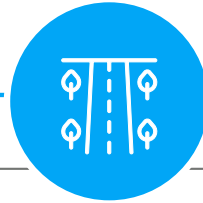

Safer and more efficient access that will be funded by development



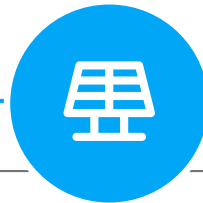
Zoned for Hospital

Developer will be required to generate the most solar energy in Boulder County



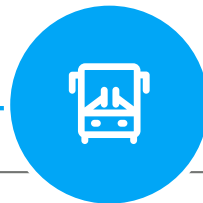

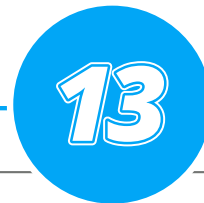
